FIRST—SECOND DISTRICT MEMBERSHIP CONTEST

At the close of the ceremony in which Dr. A. B. Rivers amputated the shirt tail of the Hon. Fred Tillman at the Henryetta Convention, a wager was entered into between the First and Second Districts to be based on percentage of membership quota in the Department Headquarters or in the mail prior to midnight of the Legion's Birthday.

The shirt tail of the losing District Commander, Roger Patterson or Elmer Chandler, is to be amputated on the program of the winning district commander at the next district convention of the winning district, according to the terms of the wager entered into between Tillman, representing the First District, and Rivers, representing the Second District, and with the approval of the Second District Convention.

Under the terms of this wager, Roger Patterson is to report to Elmer Chandler on the district convention program of the First District whenever same is set, and offer his shirt tail for amputation by Chandler. Dr. A. B. Rivers and the Hon. Fred Tillman are to serve as the judges of this amputation.
