Flag Raising Ceremony

Department, District, County and City American Legion Officials Expected To Be Present

SUNDAY AFTERNOON, APRIL 19TH

Statement by Lynn U. Stambaugh, National Commander, The American Legion, regarding the 1942 USO campaign for raising additional funds.

The United Service Organization groups are carrying the recreational program to our men in service. The American Legion indorsed the fund raising campaign of United Service Organizations in 1941. Now that we are in war there is every reason to continue our indorsement, and thereby to help in bringing entertainment and relaxation to the fighting men of our Nation.

The USO has planned a campaign to secure \$32,000,000 to be raised between May 11 and July 4 of this year.

It is my opinion that those of us who are privileged to remain at home should contribute as much as possible to every phase of the service man's welfare.

Therefore, I am happy to join with those who indorse the 1942 USO fund raising campaign. I hope that every Legionnaire will help to make this campaign successful.

All Legionnaires and Auxiliary Unit members, their families and friend are urged to attend the Flag Raising Ceremonies to be held at the Frisco railway headquarters, tomorrow, Sunday, April 19th, at 4 p. m., Frisco railway tracks and West 24th street, West Tulsa.

Mike Saxon, general chairman and his committee members, E. B. Spain, Fay Warren, Walter Prunkard, Ollie Gwynn and Miss Edna Wooden, representing the 1000 Frisco employees whose contributions made possible the purchase of the large 10x19 Flag, which will fly from a flagpole 87 feet high, have completed arrangements.

Joe Carson Post will have charge of the ceremonies. Joseph F. Herman, Post Commander will serve as Master of Ceremonies; Albert Edward Galloway, District Vice Commander will officiate as Chaplain;

Judge Oras A. Shaw will be the principal speaker; C. E. Marshall will give the tribute to the Flag; Leslie L. Spain, Chef de Gare of the 40-8 will have charge of the seating arrangements.

A uniformed Color Guard will be in charge of Alex Faulkner; members of the guard are Jim Hunt, J. Earl Simpson, Mike Saxon, R. B. Harper, Elmer Orr, Gene Prall, Roy Lind, Joe Payne and A. L. Wells.

A band concert will precede the Flag raising, given by Joe Carson Post band, under the direction of Ed-dies Gambill.

Max Fife, Department Commander and other department, district, county and city American Legion officials are expected to be present as distinguished guests, as well as high governmental officials.

The general public is cordially invited to attend this patriotic ceremony.

Commander Appoints Committee To Work With The International War Prisoners' Aid Committee

Commander Herman has appointed a special Legion Committee to work with the Tulsa Chapter of the International War Prisoners' Aid Committee. George Thompson will serve as chairman and Frank S. Huggill, Glenn Condon, Roscoe Harper, Guy C. Tetrick, S. E. Dunn, N. A. Thompson, C. O. Gittinger, W. H. Wards, Elmer Orr, L. A. Burns and A. L. Wells, committee members.

The International Y. M. C. A. has been asked to undertake the work with prisoners of war, because of its

experience during 1914-18, when it served over 6,000,000 war prisoners in 28 countries.

If these humane services to the 4,000,000 prisoners and other victims of the present war are to be maintained and extended during the year ending September 30, 1942, a total of \$502,940 is needed.

An American banker who was an official of the Y. M. C. A. in work with prisoners in the past war, said recently: "I know of no other philanthropic service for which the returns per dollar are so large."
