An American banker who was an official of the Y. M. C. A. in work with prisoners in the past war, said recently: "I know of no other philanthropic service for which the returns per dollar are so large."



Mrs. Paul C. Wheeler, Unit President announces the date of the next regular business meeting will be Tuesday, April 21st, 8 p. m., at the Hut.




Our president reports that we now have 280 members, which means we must have 53 more to complete our
