Poppy Poster Contests On

* * * * *

Rules Governing Given by the 1942 Department Head

1. Contests shall be carried on by Units in schools under their direct supervision.

2. Contest shall have three classes: First Class—Students in 4th, 5th and 6th grades; Second Class—Students in 7th, 8th and 9th grades; Third Class—Students in 10th, 11th and 12th grades.

3. Construction of Poster: a. Subject: The words "American Legion" or "American Legion Auxiliary" must be incorporated in the design of the poster. Each poster shall have a fitting slogan which must not exceed ten words. The article "a", "an" and "the" are not to be counted in the ten words.

b. Each poster must carry a picture of the Flanders Poppy in the correct color.

c. The poster shall be chipboard, mathboard, pasteboard or cardboard. Drawing paper not accepted.

d. The United States Flag shall not be used in any form on Poppy Posters.

e. The posters shall measure 14 inches wide by 20 inches high.

f. The following scale shall be used in judging posters:

1. Appeal (force with which the poster drives home the poppy message, with strict adherence to the significance of the veteran-made poppy) -----50 points

2. Artistic ability -----15 points

3. Originality -----25 points

4. Neatness -----10 points

g. Materials used for Poppy Poster shall be:

Class 1—Paper cutouts, crayons, pencils or water colors.

Class 2—Tempera water colors or oil paints.

Class 3—Tempera water colors or oil paints.

4. There is a cash award from the Department for the winners in each class, which are selected from the winning Unit posters submitted to Department. The Department winners shall be eligible to compete for

the National award. (Amounts to be announced later.)

5. Send the Unit prize-winning posters from each class to Department Headquarters, by April 1, 1942. The name and address of contestant, and the name of the Unit, must be written in ink on the back of the poster.
