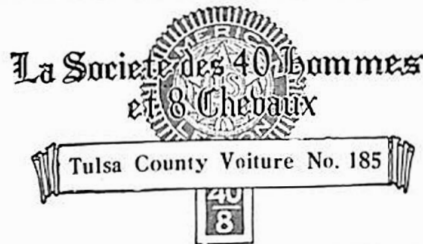

Convention Plans Will Be Studied

The Department convention Liaison committee recommended to the Department executive committee January 10th, that plans be deferred until the May meeting of the executive group, regarding the next Department convention.

No funds will be expended or obligated for other than necessary business sessions, pending the final decision as to the length of the 1942 convention, and as to whether the usual drum corps contests, parades and other entertainment will be "in order."

If it appears war conditions will cut the attendance, and if it is deemed advisable by May, the convention will be only a one or two day business session, committee members said. Rex Calvert of Blackwell is chairman and Willis Vance, Oklahoma City, and Warren Glaspey, Okmulgee, are the Liaison committee members.

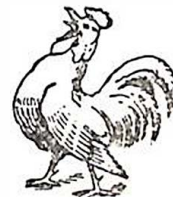
