Veterans' Organizations Will Observe Armistice Day

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, On November 11, 1918, there was much rejoicing throughout the world with the signing of the Armistice as all combatants of the many war-torn nations through a common agreement, laid aside their instruments of war and destruction, and associated themselves in the common purpose of promoting the maintenance of a beacon light of freedom for all nations and people, and

WHEREAS, The eleventh day of November of each Year has been designated as a legal public holiday by an act of Congress under the date of May 13th, 1938, and

WHEREAS, The observance of Armistice Day creates among our people that opportunity to reaffirm our devoted loyalty to the end that the American way of life may survive in a world of free men, and that the principles of freedom must not be destroyed, and that the equal justice guaranteed t teed by our forefathers must be kept fresh in the minds of our citizens.

NOW, THERFORE, I, C. H. Veale, Mayor of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, do by virtue of the power vested in me as Mayor, declare and proclaim Tuesday. November 11th, 1997 and direct that the Flag 11th, 1941 as "Armistice Day", and direct that the Flag of the United States be displayed on all Municipal buildings throughout the day. Furthermore, I call upon the Citizens of Tulsa to display the Stars and Stripes and observe the day with appropriate ceremonies as a public expression of our belief in the principles of American Democracy.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I hereunto set my han land caused the seal of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma to be affixed this 28th day of October, 1941.
