Washington, D.C.-Early consideration by the U. S. Senate of The American Legion's widows and orphans bill, H. R. 4, which was passed by the House, June 16, is now asked by National Legislative Director John Thomas Taylor. The Senate finance committee informed The American l.egion shortly after the House action that it wished to dispose of the tax bill before considering other proposals.
"This tax bill is now out of the way!" Director Taylor pointted out.

Director Taylor has now issued the following appeal to the $1,102,000$ members of The American Legion and 521,000 members of its Auxiliary:
"All members of the Legion and of the Auxiliary are requested to communicate with their two United States. Scnators, urging such senators to discuss this bill with the Senate financ" c smmittce with a view of having the bill reported and thus granting the Senate an opportunity to act upon it. A bill similar to the pending widows and orphans measure was passed by the House last Congress but died in Senate committee."
H. R. 4 would place the needv widows and orphans of the veterans of the World War on the same basis of governnent protection which is now accorded to the widows and orphans of the veterans of every other American war.

## Membership Status

The most important change in the by-laws deals with membership delinquency as found in a new Section 4. of Article 1 N .
"A member whose dues for the current war have no: heen paid by Fed. ruary first shall he classed as delinquent. If his dues are paid on or before April first, he shall automaticalIs be reinstated. If he is still delinqueme after April first, he shall be suspended from all privileges. If he is still under suspension on Dec. 31:1 of such year. his membership in The American Legion shall be forfeited. A member so suspended or whose membership hats been forfeited may be reinstated to active membership i: good standing be woie of the post and payment of current dues for the vear in which reinstatement occurs. The gost, at its option, mave also require a member whose membership has been so forfeited to par one year's arrears in dues. as a condition precedent to reinstatement."
