Convention Endorses Foreign Policy of Our Government

Milwaukee, Wisc.—Full approval and endorsement of the foreign policy of the government of the United States was voted by the 23rd national convention of The American Legion here, Wednesday, September 17th, when it adopted the report of Chairman Ray Murphy of the foreign relations committee.

His report recommended the adoption of the following resolution, which the convention did with much gusto:

"WHEREAS, we believe in our constitutional form of government and are determined that it shall be maintained as a beacon light of freedom for all nations and peoples—especially those attacked by the forces of Nazism which we condemn as opposed to the rights of free men everywhere:

"WHEREAS, the freedom of the seas has been the traditional policy of the United States since its foundation and has been so enunciated by our President; and we are opposed to any surrender of this policy or any appeasement toward the aggressor nations, Germany, Italy and Japan—toward whom we demand a policy of stern and exact justice;

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by The American Legion in National Convention assembled, that

"(a) We approve and endorse the foreign policy of the President and the Congress and
