U.S. Army Appointment

Washington, D.C.—Another member of The American Legion has been appointed to an important post in the National Defense organization. He is BRIG. GEN ALEXANDER DAY SURLLES, who was named by President Roosevelt to be *Director of the Bureau of Public Relations of the War Department*.

General Surles is a member of El Paso Post No. 36 at El Paso, Texas. He has long been interested in American Legion affairs and often has attended meetings here of the military affairs committee of the Legion.

Compensation

Washington, D. C.—Parents who lost more than one son in the armed services became eligible to receive a pension or compensation in each case as a result of the enactment of Section 2 of Public 242, approved August 21, 1941, which is chiefly a law affecting Spanish War pensions.

Section 2 of this new enactment amends Section 5 of Public 198 (July 1939) by adding "Provided, that persons entitled to pension or compensation on account of the death, disability, or service of more than one person, if otherwise entitled, shall be paid the increased rates provided by this section."
