### Oklahoma To Participate In Stimulated Air Raid

Four observation posts are established in Tulsa and two posts in each of the five outlying districts in Tulsa county.

Col. Fred G. Damman of Tulsa, is Tulsa County Air Warden. His assistants are C. E. Marshall, Tulsa; J. M. Nelson, Skiatook; Chas. T. Reid, Collinsville; C. E. Foster, Broken Arrow, and Phil Smith, Sand Springs.

Chief observers for each area will be appointed by the assistant air raid warning officers and American Legion Post Commanders. The chief observers for each area will conduct the registration of volunteer men and women as observers.
