

#### Lewis P. Clephane, A Legion Founder, Dead In Paris at 70

Lt. Comdr. Lewis P. Clephane, 79, former Washington resident Legion, died October 3 in Paris, according to word received by his brother, Walter C. Clephane, an attorney of Washington, D. C.

Comdr. Clephane was born in Washington Feb. 8, 1869, the son of Lewis and Annie Collins Clephane, both now deceased. He was educated in District public schools and was graduated from Cornell University in 1890.

He served in the Navy during World War I, and from 1917 to 1920 commanded all naval acti-Navy service gave him material for two books, "Official Naval History of the Naval Overseas ing. Transportation Service During the World War," and "Official Naval History of the Submarine Chaser in the World War."

After assisting in the organization of the American Legion, he was made first senior vice-commander of its first post. He also was one of the organizers of the United States power squadron.

He was a member of the Army and Navy Club, the Chevy Chase Club, the Capital, Yacht Club, the Society of Colonial Wars, the Society of the Descendants of Colonial Governors, the Sons of the Revolution, the Military Order of Foreign Wars, the Military Order of the World Wars, and the Military Service Legion. His college fraternity was Beta Theta.

NEW YORK. - America is almost defenseless today and therefore vulnerable to any Russian attack because of Congressional deleliction, National Commander James F. O'Neil charges in an article in the July, 1948, American Legion Magazine.

"Too many Congressmen," Commander O'Neil states, "have been afraid to take the necessary steps to protect this country for fear they would be called spendthrifts and war-mongers."

versal Military Training legislation.

"Since V-J Day we have intensified our efforts to get UMT,' the American Legion chief writes. 'with a large part of the American public joining in the campaign. Yet action has been blocked by wilful, politicallyminded Congressmen who lack the courage to permti Congress as a whole to vote on it . . . Our lawmakers seem to prefer substitute measures which will win votes while jeopardizing our national security.'

In the coming political campaign, Commander O'Neil says, voters will be hearing much about civil liberties, the rights of labor, veterans' housing and tax cuts. Important as these are, he emphasizes, they are insignificant alongside of national defense.

Urging voters to make national defense their big issue, Commander O'Neil concludes:

"I am not going to tell you what party or by name what man to choose. I am going to ask you to vote only for the men pledged to real security measures. And I am going to suggest that you do not take those pledges at face value. Check up on the record of every Congressman standing for re-election—and the record of their opponents, too. Ascertain how they stood on Selective Service, on UMT, on the augmented defense budget, on the Marshall Plan, on civil defense, on the bill for arming the Merchant Marine and on the Communist question."

In Indiana that would amount to about \$150,000,000. If it is financed by cigarets, liquor, luxury or even income taxes, the veterans' share of repaying the debt probably would be higher since those taxes fall most heavily upon active men. Its cost inevitably would be reflected in everything the veteran buys-in addition to his own direct share of the taxation.

#### Air Forces Issue Call for Ex-Airmen

The Air Force wants 10,000 former service men to help it keep the Berlin airlift and the B-29's in Europe running.

It called for them last Sunday as replacements for men whose enlistments are expiring, whose tours of foreign duty have been completed or who were sent to Europe for only temporary duty. The 10,000 will not increase the over-all Air force strength in England and Western Europe.

Qualified veterans will be accepted for enlistment in grades "commensurate with their ability and military experience." Needed are experts on aircraft maintenance, radio, radar, automotive repairmen and similar craftsmen.

Unmarried men up to 34 years old who have been discharged more than 90 days may enlist in grades up to and including technical sergeant. Dependents can not be taken overseas.

Air Force men reenlisting within 90 days of discharge automatically receive their former brade. All men accepted get an extra 20 per cent pay for overseas duty.



#### O'Neil Says U. S. Must Be Strong

National Commander James F O'Neil of the American Legion told the Miami Lions Club Thursday that prevention of World War III is the most serious prob-
