The 1948 Poppy sales program was launched by a meeting at Muskogee, January 31, which was attended by all District Presidents and Commanders and District Poppy Chairmen of both the Legion and Auxiliary. The meeting was in charge of Arlis Lanham of Seminole, Legion Department Chairman and Helen Rice of Ponca City, Auxiliary Poppy Chairman. They were assisted by Juanita Edwards of Oklahoma City, Hazel McAllister of Ardmore, Dan Jennings of Edmond and Phil Smith of Sand Springs, all members of the Poppy Committee.

The purpose of the meeting was to work out sales ideas and make plans for District schools to be held in each District under the supervision of the District President, Commander and Poppy Chairmen. Poppy Chairmen of Units and Posts, as well as other interested members, were invited to the Muskogee meeting.

The Poppy quota for this year has been set at one million. Although poppies are made the year around in the veterans hospitals, the entire output is sold through the effort of the Legion and Auxiliary on window boards in April and in street sales of single poppies in May.

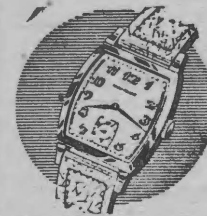
